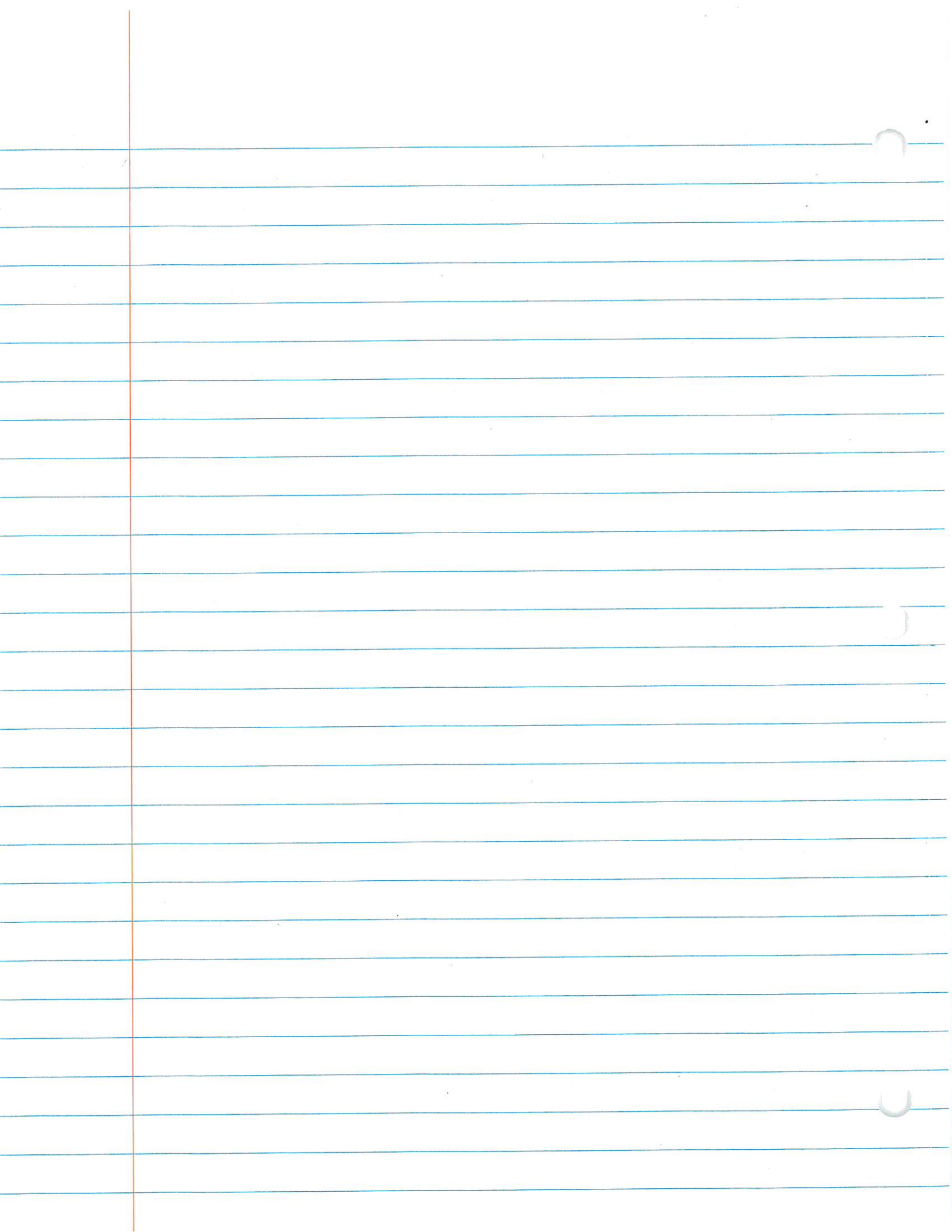
## Action
